Good Friday Witnessing and Homeless Outreach

On March 25, we had an incredible time behind the PanAsian Buffet where many homeless people live at Adams and Whitaker Avenues in Northeast Philly. So many lined up to receive a bagged lunch, toiletries, hoodies, new underwear, undershirts and socks. James Smallwood, formally homeless and a 37th class graduate, challenged each of them to go with him right then, to rehab or recovery after Danny presented the Gospel.

On April 28 in Kensington, at a very popular spot where the homeless gather, we were overwhelmed with a huge number of homeless men and women desperate for the new rain jackets, hoodies, underwear, undershirts and socks. At the corner of Griscom and Foulkrod Streets, the 39th class of the Mel Floyd School of Evangelism did "on-the-job-training" at our Crusade. January - April 2016, six African-American men were killed in this immediate area. We made great impact with the gospel as we went door-to-door North, South, East and West, even to Frankford Ave. Past graduates of our school gave testimony of how they were delivered from drug addiction and a life of crime. Seven souls were saved and we plan to return on Saturday, June 25 because the residents asked us to come back and we believe there is more work to be done.
